A Family Affair

One of Margie Hojara-Hadsell's favorite things about teaching at TEC is that priceless look on a rider's face the first time they get to trot on their horse. The TEC community is like family to her, and she feels fortunate to be able to give back to it. She also feels fortunate to be able to log thousands of steps on her fitness tracker while doing something she loves!

Margie has been a PATH-certified instructor since 1991, and has been a part of TEC since its beginning. She and her husband, Ron, team-taught for many years. For her stepdad, Robert Egan, who was a professional horse trainer and **a firm believer in the power of horses to change lives**, it became the highlight of his last years. Emily, Margie's mom, is still involved in TEC.

During every lesson, TEC instructors have to think about how they're going to help each rider achieve their individual goals, and at the same time consider the well-being of each horse.

The instructors also have day jobs, including an occupational therapist, a substance abuse counselor, a speech pathologist, a social worker, and Margie's job as a Limited Licensed Psychologist. Although Margie chooses to volunteer her time, most of the TEC instructors are paid, partially through your donations, in order to maintain the high standards of the program.

Margie has many wishes for TEC. She wishes more people knew about it, and how fantastic it is. She wishes people would come for a visit and decide to volunteer. She wishes she would win the lottery, so she could donate the money to TEC. And she wishes people understood how good volunteering at the barn makes a person feel, and how at the end of a lesson, she always walks away happy.

TEC Named Make A Mark Recipient

The Make A Mark campaign was launched in 2018 by Holt Bosse, a full-service marketing agency in St. Joe, as a company-wide initiative that allows the entire team to review applicants and vote on the recipient. The winning nonprofit receives the equivalent of up to \$50,000 of marketing talent and time from the agency's team. Any outside marketing expenses; such as, print cost, ad space, or air time is at the expense of the recipient.



"We are beyond thrilled, this is an incredible opportunity for us," shared Autumn Zick, TEC Board President and Instructor. "Like most volunteer-run organizations, we struggle to find marketing resources to help us spread the word about our organization and this is definitely going to help us make a mark!"

Items being considered for the project include the creation of marketing templates for flyers and communications, audience-specific brochures, print ads, and radio spots. The agency will present an overview of the projects with estimated costs. If costs exceed \$50,000, TEC will prioritize the projects to work within the allotted budget. Watch for updates to come as the project progresses.

Donors Make "I Did It!" Moments Happen



TEC extends a heartfelt thanks to the **St. Joseph Congregational Church UCC** for their generous donation of \$2,000 for hay to feed our hungry herd. The cost of taking care of horses has gone up, and this will take a good-size bite out of our yearly hay expenses!

Riders like Johnny Valantiejus will reap the rewards of a \$3,500 grant to TEC from **Heart of Cook**. This money is designated for our Tuition Assistance Program (TAP). TAP

is offered to those families who can't afford to pay the full cost of therapeutic riding lessons. The participant fee charged for a group lesson is \$30 (although our cost to provide that lesson is \$45 per person), and our TAP fund was nearly empty. Thank you, Heart of Cook, for making it possible for these riders to participate at TEC!



Thanks to the **Berrien Community Foundation Youth Advisory Committee**, TEC now has \$6,000 in our horse-purchasing budget. They must have realized the importance of these team members, because they gave us their "For Good" grant in the entire amount we requested. This is so greatly appreciated!
