A Veteran's Healing Journey

When Adrianna Ruark was 19, she enlisted in the United States Air Force (USAF). By that time in her young life, she had already experienced the nightmare of repeated sexual assaults. Once in the military, she again became the victim of multiple rapes, including once while deployed to the Middle East. Adrianna eventually returned stateside, completed her 6 1/2 year stint, and took a medical retirement in 2016.

When Adrianna got home, she knew she needed to find ways to deal with the trauma she had experienced. She turned first to Papa (God), who she says was with her the whole time, and who has played a large part in her healing. Having been an artist her whole life, she began spending a good deal of time drawing and painting, and decided to create a series of paintings as a way to express her feelings. She has found the process to be therapeutic, and in addition has begun working on a book documenting her military experiences. She has also become very involved in training and competing as an athlete with the Wounded Warrior Project. She trains on her own in a number of different sports, and competes with other Wounded Warrior athletes from around the country. Unfortunately, like so many other things this past year, the competitions have had to be held remotely due to the COVID pandemic.

Despite the time she devotes to these activities, Adrianna was looking for something else she could do, as a veteran, to help restore her health and wellbeing. An online search led her to TEC. She had always liked horses, and had even participated in two different therapeutic riding programs while serving in the USAF. But what she found at TEC was a program designed specifically for veterans and their family members, called TEC WITH VETS. Many veterans like Adrianna have benefitted from this program, thanks to the generosity of the Stephen E. Upton Love Your Community Grant through the Berrien Community Foundation.

When she first started riding at TEC, Adrianna was hesitant and unsure of herself, but she persisted. After a year of riding Grace, her confidence and independence have increased. She is now ready to ride another TEC horse to further develop her riding skills. She also has found the time spent at the barn to be a good outlet for her stress.

Describing the emotional healing she has experienced through her participation at TEC, Adrianna says that despite not being a "touchy"



person, she is now able to give hugs. Asked if she is talking about hugging horses, she says, "No, I've always been able to hug horses. Now I can give hugs to people."

Garth ... The Heart of the Horse

We know that all horses are special, but there are some who are called to share their hearts with others. One such horse was gentle giant Boru, a huge Irish Draft/Cleveland Bay cross who had a heart as big as he was. He was owned by Janeen Pasquill and leased to Cathy Alwine. The Heart of the Horse Award, given each year by Cathy and Bill Alwine, celebrates the impact horses like their beloved Boru have had on people.

The horses who have been honored with this award have come in different shapes, sizes, and breeds, but they all share one important attribute: "heart", that magical combination of kindness, gentleness, and willingness to try. Add to that mix being "intuitive, versatile, and rock solid", and you have TEC's own Garth, 2020's Heart of the Horse Award recipient.

Garth, who is 28-years old, is a Halflinger Quarter Horse cross who came to TEC 13 years ago. Previously used as a rental horse, Garth soon showed that he had the makings of an amazing therapy horse. Because of his short and sturdy stature and his unflappable nature, he has been TEC's "go-to" horse for most of those years. A

little boy who needs a smallish horse? Put him on Garth. A girl with Cerebral Palsy? Garth will be a "Steady Eddie". A fearful adult? You guessed it – Garth. He has been hand-painted on by school children and ridden independently by veterans, and through it all, he has done every job like a champion.

Erica Anglemeyer rode Garth for several years. She says, "It gave me a freedom I didn't have before. He helped me physically and mentally. He helped me to sit up straighter. He gave me the sensation of feeling what it's like to walk." Although Erica is no longer able to participate in TEC, she adds, "I have so many great memories! I love Garth and miss riding him so much!"

Garth has spent half his life serving those with special needs in our society. TEC Board President and PATH-certified Riding Instructor, Autumn Zick, describes him as "a blessing, especially now! In TEC's 14-year history, no other horse has given more or made as much of an impact on participants and volunteers as Garth. I can honestly say in my 40-year career he's the very best horse I have worked with."

Another example is Pam, a mother of one of our participants, who lost a leg over a year ago in a motorcycle accident. She had ridden horses as a child and knew she wanted to do that again. That was the motivation for her to spend long, hard hours in physical therapy to make that dream come true. After a year of treatment, Pam came to TEC to prove that all of her efforts would allow her to ride. With determination written all over her face Pam rode TEC horse, Elsa. Tears of joy were shed that day as another "I Did It!" moment was witnessed.





Pam shared about her experience at TEC, "It makes me feel whole. There's happiness, fulfilment, and excitement. I feel like I'm in control and I can work with my horse. I rode a lot as a kid spending many hours with my horse. He was my best friend. It feels like I got my best friend back."

For Liam, Pam, and the other TEC participants the horses not only provide the motivation but the means to improve physical, emotional, and intellectual needs. 


Papa Vinos ITALIAN KITCHEN
